



Calls From the Community in 2022

2022 Overview for Wellesley Township

- 7,221 Calls for Service in the Township
 - Up 5.5% from 2021
- 184 "Priority 1" Calls
- 20 Calls for Service per day on average
- Average response time is less than 19 minutes



Traffic and Road Safety

- Traffic Safety efforts represent the majority of calls for service in Woolwich Township
- In September 2023, WRPS laid 121 Road Safety Charges.
 - 45 charges for Speeding
 - 3 charges for Impaired Driving
 - 2 Distracted Driving
 - 1 Seatbelt Infract
- Targeted enforcement efforts utilize public reporting
