Traffic and Road Safety

- Traffic Safety efforts represent the majority
 of calls for service in Woolwich Township
- From July to September 2023, WRPS laid 374 Road Safety Charges
 - 182 charges for Speeding
 - 5 charges for Impaired Driving
 - 4 charges for Distracted Driving
 - 2 charges for Seatbelt Infractions
- Targeted enforcement efforts utilize public reporting
