

Route 21 Elmira Overview

- Operating:
 - Weekdays: 6am to 10pm
 - Weekends: 7am to 7pm
 - 30 minute frequency
- Addition of later weekday evening service and Sunday service starting fall 2024
- \$1.34 Million Annual Operation Cost (2023)







Route 21 Elmira: 10-Year Annual Ridership




Route 79 Flex Breslau

- Pilot launched in spring 2022
- Operates Weekday 6am-10am, 2pm to 6pm and 10:45pm to 11:45pm
- Connection points added at Central Station and Kitchener Train Station in June 2024
- \$205k Annual operating cost (2023)
- 4 Boarding Per Hour (2024 YTD)

Drop offs, Summer 2024




Route 78 Fountain

- Launched in fall 2024
- Linking Sportsworld Station and Region of Waterloo International Airport via Maple Grove Rd & Fountain St N.
- Weekdays 6-10am, 2-7pm and 10:30-Midnight



Kiwanis Transit

- Elmira Community Bus (Pilot)
 - Monday to Saturday, 30 minute frequency
 - \$135k Annual Operating Cost (2023)
- Specialized Transit Service covering all of Woolwich Township for eligible mobilityimpaired residents




Township Transit Strategy (TTS)

- Goals:
 - Expand upon existing rural transit service to effectively & efficiently meet the needs of Waterloo Region's rural residents
 - Consult with Waterloo Region's townships to design & cost (not fund) improved transit services, considering various options to meet the unique needs of each township
- Project timeline has been coordinated with GRT's 2025-2030 Business Plan (BP) and MobilityPlus & Kiwanis Transit Business Plan (MBP)

Township Transit Strategy (TTS)

- Round 1 Engagement
 - Engagement launch on June 27 with BP and MPB Town Hall
 - Woolwich virtual information session on July 17 (recording online at grt.ca/township)
 - Pop-up sessions jointly with the BP and MBP
 - TTS public survey from July 4 to August 2
 - Partnership with Regional Public Health mobile vaccine clinics
 - Stakeholder discussions



Township Transit Strategy Next Steps

- Round 2 engagement this fall
 - In-person open houses
 - Share what we've heard from round 1 engagement
 - Share refined proposals base on community feedback and additional technical analysis
 - Proposal estimate costs
 - Survey
