WHY?

- This equates to better Mental and Physical wellness and less screen time!

HOW?

- We found credible coaches that we want to support
- Granting them access to fields at their convenience allows them to provide quality soccer programs to the community
- Peter (founder) comes from a mental health background and puts a huge emphasis on treating kids the right way
- Peter runs free soccer clinics for underprivileged children every week
- Grassroots approach, insuring the children's first experiences are fun and enjoyable so they fall in love with the game
- To provide good role models around child friendly soccer
